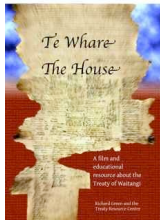

This publication is a revised and updated edition of 'Treaty Questions and Answers' first published in 1989 by Network Waitangi. It

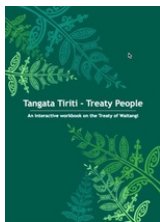

## Te Tiriti o Waitangi Poster

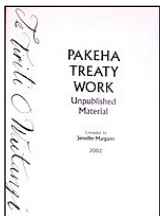

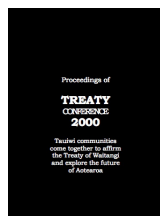


## Programme on Racism Collected Newsletters 2002
